



Modern Slavery Statement 2017/18

This statement is made pursuant Section 54 of the Modern Slavery Act 2015 and sets out the steps that CSSP has taken and is continuing to take to ensure that modern slavery or human trafficking is not taking place within our business or supply chain.

Modern slavery encompasses slavery, servitude, human trafficking and forced labour. CSSP has a zero tolerance approach to any form of modern slavery. We are committed to acting ethically and with integrity and transparency in all business dealings and to putting effective systems and controls in place to safeguard against any form of modern slavery taking place within the business or our supply chain.

Our business

CSSP provide software to the construction industry, from our offices in the UK, and Australia.

As a software house who develop our own internally produced software, our suppliers are few, and are generally limited to other software businesses who provide tools.

Our high risk areas

CSSP has few risk areas, those that may be construed as a risk area involve third party development.

Our policies

We operate internal policies to ensure that we are conducting business in an ethical and transparent manner, including this policy.

The CSSP Staff handbook states the internal policy and directs to this document.

Our suppliers

CSSP does not operate a supplier policy or maintains a preferred supplier list as CSSP is below the threshold of this requirement.

CSSP do however confirm that no part of the business operations contradicts this policy.

Training

We conduct training for staff so that they understand the signs of modern slavery and what to do if they suspect that it is taking place within our supply chain.
